- ASB Damage and inconsiderate behaviour, North Somercotes. Evenings and weekends.
- 4. ASB inconsiderate behaviour, Holton le Clay. Evenings and weekends.

YOU SAID – WE DID Action against set priorities

- Reported incidents of ASB in the winter months have reduced. The NPT continue to work with partners to resolve issues and reduce incidents in the area.
- 2. Reported incidents of minor ASB in the village have been few in recent months, however serious arson offences have been prevalent in recently.
- Incidents of ASB in the village have reduced in recent weeks. Patrols and visits to the area by police staff continue.
- 4. We are still receiving sporadic reports regarding ASB in the area and we continue to attend and deal with the situations as found.
- 5. Although the number of ASB incidents across the area are low at the present, however with the seasonal adjustment of the clocks and better weather it is anticipated that ASB will become more prevalent. Please report incidents when they are happening so that we are aware of problems and are able to attend promptly.

UPDATES.

- A number of warrants were executed under the misuse of drugs act in January, Several arrests were made and a number of people remain on police bail in relation to the supply of illegal substances. A large contingent of officers from neighbouring forces assisted with the operation, which affected a number of villages in the Louth Rural area.
- 2. The investigation into the finding of body parts in the area of Tetney Lock continues. Officers carried out extensive searches in the local area with many hours being required by diving units to search the waterways in the area.
- 3. Due to huge cuts in police funding Lincolnshire Police are undergoing a number of major changes in the structure of the force. The changes should not adversely effect the service provided to the public
