The Black Lady of Bradley Woods

While researching Holton le Clay, I got side-tracked by the Black Lady of Bradley Woods which is just outside Grimsby towards Laceby.

Alleged eyewitnesses have described her as being young and pretty, around 5'6" tall, dressed in a flowing black cloak and a black hood that obscures her hair but reveals her mournful, pale, tear-soaked face. According to the legend, she has never harmed anyone and has only ever proved to be a pitiful, if unnerving, sight.

Myth has it that during the Wars of the Roses, or the Barons' Wars, a young woodsman and his wife lived with their baby son in a cottage in Bradley Woods. Eventually, the woodsman left his family to fight, leaving his wife to bring up the baby alone. After many months there was no news of the woodsman. Every day, she held her child and walked to the edge of the woods, waiting for the sight of her husband coming home from the wars, until one day, the enemy army crossed the Humber and marched through the area on the way to attack Lincoln. As she was leaving her cottage, the woman was set upon by three horsemen who attacked her, snatched the baby boy and rode off laughing into the woods. Heartbroken and humiliated, she wandered the woods searching in vain for her child and husband. After her death people began to see her wandering the woods, carrying on her never-ending search.

The story is known to have been told for many generations. Parents once used it to frighten children; this appears to have been a common practice among parents in the area, and children were warned that if they were not safely in bed by a certain time, "the black lady will get you!"

One theory that has been put forward is that the Black Lady is the ghost of a nun. She appears dressed in black and at nearby Nunsthorpe where a convent existed until the Reformation. This theory gives no reason as to why the Black Lady should have moved from Nunsthorpe to Bradley, 2 miles away. Also, though she may be dressed in black, few if any, eyewitnesses have described her appearance as matching that of a nun.

Another possible explanation is that she is a spinster who, at one time, lived a life of isolation in her cottage in the woods, far enough away from the village. If village children had come across a woman living on her own in the woods, who became angry when her privacy and solitude were breached, then imaginary tales of witchcraft could have exaggerated the legend. She evidently appears at times in photographs. So if you are ever there, look closely and let us know!

Heat oven to 200C/180Cfan/gas 6. Mix oil, syrup, thyme, cumin and red wine together with seasoning. Par boil the swede till just softening. Toss the swede and onions in the mix then spread out in a large roasting tin.

Parish Council News

As the clerk to the Parish Council, I recently found myself deeply immersed in a poignant journey, one that began when a kind resident of New Waltham offered a piece of a Lancaster Bomber's bomb bay door for installation at the A16 War Memorial. The piece had been lying in a hedge in Nottinghamshire for almost 50 years before it was discovered and authenticated and it eventually found its way back to Lincolnshire. This generous donation sparked my curiosity, leading me to delve in to a treasure trove of paperwork that accompanied the relic. As a selfprofessed geek, I became engrossed in the lives of the young airmen and their families, driven by a desire to honour their bravery. In March of 1943, the Lancaster III ED 549 of the 100 Squadron embarked on a mission from Waltham Airfield to France, laying mines or 'Gardening Exercise' as it was also known. Battling dense fog, the plane tragically crashed just 400 yards from Langar Airfield in Nottinghamshire. My quest for knowledge led me to Tim Chamberlain, a historian who had extensively documented the tragic event. Tim graciously shared his research and invited me to visit the crash site. Standing there, surrounded by the echoes of history, I felt a real sense of connection with the brave souls aboard the Lancaster.





With the support of the community and Tim's expertise, a memorial now stands at the crash site, adorned with photographs of the crew and the Lancaster, etching their names into the village's collective memory. Driving past the airfield where the pilot aimed to land, I couldn't shake the thought that a few more seconds might have altered the course of their fate.

Tim's generous donation of his research inspired me to preserve this history for future generations. My hope is that I will be able to create a display in the village hall, allowing residents of Holton le Clay to delve into the sacrifices made by these brave young men.

Love is in the air

February is well known for St Valentine's Day, the 14th being the day of his death in Rome in the 3rd century. Valentine was the name of a couple of legendary Christian martyrs whose lives are historically based but there is little reliable information about him. He has become the patron saint of lovers, epileptics and beekeepers.

What makes the history of Valentine's Day complicated is that two lives are described, firstly as a Roman priest and physician who was martyred during the persecution of the Christians circa 270 and a basilica was built over his grave. Secondly as the bishop of Terni, Italy who was martyred, probably in Rome, and his relics taken to Terni. These may be variations of the same man.

Legends also say that St Valentine signed a letter, 'from your Valentine' to his jailor's daughter whom he befriended and cured her blindness, or his action to defy the emperor's orders to marry couples in secret to spare the husband from going to war. Valentine's Day dates back to at least the 14th century as a lovers' festival.

'Loving one another' is a key to Jesus' teaching. Before his death and resurrection, he gave his disciples this new commandment, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." Love in this sense is not a romantic or a sexual love; it means a deep, caring love such as Jesus showed when he was here in person. Christians have aimed at achieving this and sharing God's love since that time.
