

FLAMINGO PINK PARENTS OF THE LAGOON

I'm four feet tall, but only weigh 16 pounds. That's less thansome Christmas turkeys! My long skinny legs are perfect forsifting through mud in the soggy coastal lagoons of SouthAmerica.6

God gave me an oversized, curved bill, but no teeth. I have a large tongue, which forces water and mud through a sort of

filter. The filter collects food like worms, insect larvae, and tiny plants like algae and diatoms. My webbed feet have four toes – three in front and the fourth high at the back. These feet would not work for an animal that needs to climb, but my creator knew I would need to steady myself in the slippery lagoon.



My feet grip mud like suction cups. For the sake of safety, my

mate nest is six to hollow spring, that the

and I live in a colony of several thousand birds. The two of us built a out of mud and vegetation. Our nest twelve inches high, with a 12-inch area in the top. When I breed in the I lay a single oblong-shaped egg in spot. Both of us take turns sitting on egg for 28 to 31 days each. After welcoming our greyish white chick the world, we take turns feeding it,

too. Our baby will not be able to fend for itself until it is about two months old, but together we prepare it for independence. Some of the food in my diet contains high amounts of a special pigment called carotene. If I eat a lot of it, it will turn my new feathers pink and red. God thought of everything when he created me.
