January in the garden

- Plant bare-root roses, shrubs, hedging and ornamental trees, as long as the ground isn't frozen
- Take root cuttings of fleshy-rooted perennials such as oriental poppies, acanthus and verbascums
- Establish new colonies of snowdrops and hellebores by buying plants in flower, so you can choose the prettiest blooms
- Clear away soggy, collapsed stems of perennials and compost them
- Take hardwood cuttings from deciduous shrubs, such as forsythia, willow and viburnum
- Remove and bin hellebore foliage marked with black blotches, to limit the spread of leaf spot disease
- Press mistletoe berries into the bark of apple trees to establish your own mistletoe plants
- Check that small alpines don't become smothered by fallen leaves and other wind-blown debris
- Deadhead winter pansies and other bedding regularly, and remove any foliage affected by downy mildew
- Move deciduous shrubs that are in the wrong place to more suitable sites
- Check for rot on stored bulbs and tubers, and ensure dahlia and canna tubers haven't totally dried out
- Continue pruning climbing roses, while they are dormant

- An **old Lincolnshire tradition** said that front doors were used for only three things: a new baby, a bride, and a coffin
- The Lincolnshire Wolds Walking Festival attracts ramblers from all over the country
- The first Briton to perform a **space walk**, Michael Foale, was born here
- There is a 'champion of the local dialect' living in Minting; Farmer Wink
- The **Lincolnshire Bagpipe** was once very popular in the county but died out in the 19th century
- 'The Lincolnshire Poacher' song is the unofficial county anthem
- The Lincolnshire Sausage Festival is held every year in October at Lincoln Castle
- Grimsby Smoked Fish achieved protected status in 2009
- The Lincolnshire Show began in 1869
- The county flower is the Common Dog-violet
- The Lincoln Imp is a carving on the Lincoln Cathedral, said to have been a devil that was turned to stone by an angel
- The current **Lincolnshire flag** was officially revealed in 2005 following a campaign by BBC Radio Lincolnshire

In **Spain**, it is customary to consume 12 grapes, one with each strike of the clock. Each grape represents good luck for a month. Having tried this one, its best to skin the grapes and also remove the pips! There's also the tradition of wearing red underwear, so Cupid brings you love.

In **Columbia**, you will see people carrying an empty suitcase around the block in the hope of a travel-filled New Year.

Residents of **Denmark** throw old plates and glasses against the doors of family and friends to banish bad spirits. They also stand on chairs and jump off together at midnight to leap into January.

In **Finland** they go to a lot of effort and cast molten tin into a container and interpret the casting once cool. A heart or ring means a wedding, a ship predicts travel, and a pig declares plenty of food.

There will be round shapes all over the **Philippines** that represent coins to symbolise prosperity. They also do the twelve grapes thing and wear polka dots for luck.

Brazil is another country that believes in wearing red underwear that will bring you luck. They also have a yellow option to bring you money. [might try that one!]

Greece has a tradition of hanging an onion on the front door. It is a symbol of rebirth. On New Year's Day, parents wake their children by tapping them on the head with the onion!

CHEDDAR AND PICKLE PUFFS

A perfect recipe for using up Christmas left-over pickles and cheeses-be adventurous!

- 1 jar of chunky pickle [or leftovers mixed]
- 1 roll of premade puff pastry

250g grated cheddar or other hard cheese 1 egg for egg wash



- 1. Roll our your pastry and cut down the middle horizontally and vertically into four rectangles.
- 2. Then, cut a diagonal line across each rectangle to make eight triangles.
- 3. Add desired amount of piccalilli and cheddar to the centre of four of the triangles. Egg wash edges of those and then layer on top the remaining triangle pastry pieces.
- 4. With a fork, press down on all edges to seal the puffs.
- 5. Place on baking tray and oven for 15 minutes on 200 or until golden and cooked.
- 6. Enjoy!
