There were action pictures of me in the local newspapers, and even a cartoon showing four footballs flying past me when we lost 4-2 to Northampton Town. I've won the trophies. Once, my manager informed me that scouts from Sheffield Wednesday had come to watch me. I thought, "This is it. I'm going to the top." Twenty minutes before the end I was stretchered off the pitch, legs smashed. Goodbye to professional football.

It was my 'be all and end all' wiped out in an instant; I was devastated. My father, a wonderful Christian preacher, said, "When you fall off your bike, the best thing is to get back on again, do your best in life but don't make work your 'be all and end all'." I heeded the first bit but not the second until I found myself suffering a complete breakdown at 52 years old. Then I remembered all my father's words. Since then, following in my father's footsteps, becoming a Christian, I know that worldly fame and fortune are temporary things. When we make Jesus Christ our 'be all and end all' our lives change from a 'win some, lose some' position to a win, win position.

The only sport I've come across in the Bible is running. In Corinthians Paul says, "You've all been to the stadium and seen the athletes race. Everyone runs; one wins. Run to win. All good athletes train hard. They do it for a gold medal that tarnishes and fades. You're after one that's gold eternally." It's a win, win life with Jesus. Why settle for anything less?
