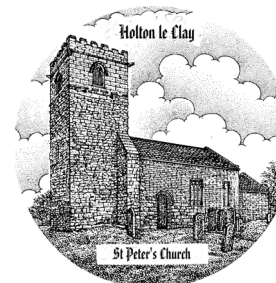

Defibrillators

There are two community defibrillators within the village. They are located on the side of the village hall in Pinfold Lane and on the side of the Vintage Car Garage on Louth Road.

Laura Mcphee Memorial Fund

Tracy Mcphee has made a very generous donation of a defibrillator and cabinet to the village. The parish council will pay for the installation of the equipment at the entrance to the 8 Acres Playing Field. A new power supply is needed so once this is in place the defibrillator will be installed. Thank you so much to Tracy and the Laura Mcphee Memorial Fund for their generosity in providing this life saving equipment to Holton Le Clay.

WW1 Memorial

The Parish Council has recently installed a memorial plaque near the RAF Memorial as a tribute to the fallen soldiers of the First World War who lived in Holton Le Clay. It has been agreed to purchase a WW1 Commemorative Bench to go alongside the plaque and the Silent Soldier that stands at the entrance. Councillor Mik Boon has kindly raised £400 with a Just Giving Fund and is donating the money to the parish council to contribute towards the cost.

Junior Council

The Junior School Council has recently completed a project that they have been working on for the last couple of months that will help to keep our village clean. The parish council enlisted the children's help in recycling old lemonade bottles and turning them into 'dog poo bag dispensers'. The bottles will be placed around the village close to litter bins with a message that invites dog walkers to help themselves to bags if they find themselves without one. All they ask is that residents refill the dispensers when they are passing. It is hoped that the project will encourage residents to clean up after their pets and dispose of the waste responsibly.

Junior Playing Field

The new climbing frame for the Junior Playing Field will be installed on 2nd September 2019.
