Holton-le-Clay Parish Council who are responsible for the village grass cutting, the village Maintenance Operative, the Junior Playing Field, the 8 Acre field, the Cemetery & Parish Gardens, Provision of (but not running of) the Village Hall.

Defibrillators

There are two community defibrillators within the village. They are located on the side of the village hall in Pinfold Lane and on the side of the Vintage Car Garage on Louth Road.

New Councillors

The Parish Council has welcomed 3 more new councillors – Alan Green, Matthew Star and David Searle. We are pleased to announce that we now have a full council of 11 members.

Our parish councillor Siobhan Weller has now stepped down from the role but continues her work as District Councillor and will still attend parish council meetings. Siobhan has been a valuable member of the parish council and she will be greatly missed.

Crime

There has been a significant increase in residential burglaries over the last two months and police are working tirelessly to catch the culprits. The criminals are mainly targeting properties that have been left empty whilst the owners are on holiday. They are also using the rear entrance – usually gaining access through patio doors. They are looking for jewellery and cash.

The police are urging residents to be extra vigilant during this time and to ensure their property is secure at all times. If you have an elderly or vulnerable neighbour who may not be aware of the increase in crime, it may be a good idea to check on them and to make sure their doors and windows are secure.

If you have any concerns or if you have any information in relation to these crimes please contact the police on either 101 or 999 if it is an emergency.
