

ON THE BEACH

Early in the morning, Jesus stood on the shore, but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. John 21: 4

When I was a young boy, a friend of mine took two large boards and carved big, ugly footprints on one side of each board. He tied these on his shoes and walked on a sandy beach near here. He hoped that people would see the big, ugly footprints and think that some strange animal had been there. Several of us saw the footprints in the sand, but we knew they were not made by an animal. We knew that our friend, who liked to play jokes, was the footprint maker. We recognized his work.

One night after Jesus rose from the dead, the disciples went fishing. Early in the morning, as they were coming into shore, they saw a man standing on the shore, but they could not tell who it was. Maybe they were too far out in the water, or maybe it was foggy that early in the morning. But whatever the reason, they did not recognise Jesus.

Jesus called out to the fishermen and asked if they had caught anything. They said they hadn't, so Jesus told them to throw their nets on the other side of the boat. They still did not know who he was, but they did what he said, and immediately, they caught so many fish that the nets were too heavy to pull into the boat.

At that point, John recognizes Jesus. How do you think John knew it was Jesus? Well, I doubt if John knew it was Jesus because he could see his face. I think it was because he knew the kind of things Jesus did. John knew that only Jesus, who had fed five thousand people with five loaves and two fish, could fill a net so full of fish.

I'll bet that you would know Jesus by the things he would do. Would Jesus heal blind people? Would Jesus cheat on a test? Would Jesus talk to children? See, you would know Jesus by the things he would do. If you say that you are a follower of Jesus, then people should be able to see that you are a Christian by the things you do. If we follow Jesus, we will do good things, like he did, and people will know that we are Christians.
