Thought for May

The month of May has two public holidays, May Day and the Spring holiday which used to be called Whitsun or Pentecost. It's a time when the weather becomes warmer, the sun shines brighter and we enjoy the garden and the countryside – well, weather permitting! Whatever, it's certainly the time when nature comes fully into life. In our garden, it's been interesting to see plants spring into life which only a few weeks ago had been invisible. We await the flowers coming into bloom to bring about a blaze of colour which attracts the bugs and bees and butterflies.

For the church, we have two festivals, that of Ascension and Pentecost. Today, neither of these have much impact on public life. Ascension is a difficult concept as we imagine a picture of Jesus disappearing into the sky. Whatever happened physically, Jesus' earthly ministry was at an end and his disciples knew that they had to continue telling the good news of salvation to people. At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came to the disciples as Jesus had promised them. Jesus was not walking beside them but God was with them through the Holy Spirit inspiring, and guiding them.

This was the birth of the Christian Church and the Holy Spirit enables us to pray to God and to talk to others about our faith. Today, not a lot of people are interested in the Church and prefer to turn away, but God's love is for all and that is the Christian message, one that is exciting, interesting and worth hearing.

Have some fun during these holidays, perhaps remembering that Pentecost is a time to say 'Happy Birthday' to the church.

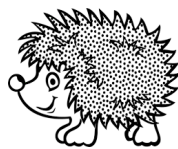

About 600 years after Jesus lived, a Celtic saint from Brittany (northern France) called Cadfan came to the island and founded a monastery there. It is thought that each monk had their own little 'cell' that was shaped like a beehive, and the cells were built round a central church.

From that time onwards, many thousands of Christians have come to Bardsey over the years, and have found it quiet and peaceful. People can be alone with God. The island became a 'people' sanctuary. Long ago some of these Christian visitors stayed there and died and were buried on the island. That is how it got its name: 'the island of 20,000 saints'.

The saints were probably the many pilgrims who are buried there. People coming to Bardsey today pray in places where Christians have prayed for nearly 1,500 years. Celtic Christians were very aware of all the people who had lived before them and all the Christians around the world. They did not feel 'alone', even when they were on an island like Bardsey.

What would your 'people sanctuary' look like? Would it be an island? Close your eyes and imagine people like you but from earlier times. Try to imagine the different clothes and hairstyles. For thousands of years Christians have been worshipping and praying. This is a prayer that Christians sometimes say to remind them of that.

'Therefore with angels and archangels, and all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name.'

**BARDSEY ISLAND**

Bardsey Island (Ynys Enlli) is a small island that lies off the tip of North Wales. Pilgrims have been travelling to this rocky island for nearly 1,500 years. There is little on the island: a few ruins, a couple of farms and lots of birds and seals. It is not easy to get to Bardsey, you can only get there by boat and the sea is very rough round the island. Why do people still want to come? Some come for the wildlife; the island is a bird sanctuary. Others come for a different reason. Bardsey's other name is 'the island of 20,000 saints'.
