#### Last month was the 45<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Holton News

This excerpt from the December 1973 magazine tells us some more about the development of the magazine:

#### ABOUT THIS MAGAZINE

1973

Well we have done it! In January of this year we started Holton News in its present form; previously it had been a small church Magazine with a circulation of under 300 per month. Now we have a magazine with a variety of village news, three times we have an additional and it is delivered to every home in Holton - 900 copies. (or as those who produce it are well aware - 6,300 sheets a month!)

So this December edition completes the full twelve months. Several enquiries have been made as to how this magazine is produced..... the editor invites contributions by the 20th. of the month; then in the days following the magazine is compiled. Attempts are made to ensure variety in the material presented; care is taken not to give news which is stale, for example it is pointless including items which have been widely reported in the local press. At the same time we are pleased that occasionally this year this magazine has had a few 'firsts' with the news!

How is it possible to produce it free of charge? - three reasons: 1. The magazine is compiled, adverts set up, stencils typed and duplicated at the Vicarage. Thus the only cost is the paper, stencils, ink and inset.

- 2. Materials are purchased in large quantities by Holton P.C.C. The full cost for materials and inset amount to £260; almost £200 is received from advertising, while the remainder we hope will be met by individual donations.
- 3. The magazine is collated, stapled and delivered by volunteers.
