Thought for April

Easter is a time for celebration, for sharing festive food with family and friends. The main meal may be roast lamb which represents the night when God rescued the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. He told them to mark their doorposts with the blood of a lamb that had been killed, get dressed ready for the long journey, roast the lamb, eat it with herbs and unleavened bread, and then leave quickly, so that God would pass over their houses and they would be spared from the effects of the last plague.

The Simnel cake is a fruit cake covered with marzipan and has 11 marzipan balls on the top. They represent the disciples but omit Judas who went to betray Jesus. The hot cross bun reminds us of Jesus' crucifixion, the cross on top, the fruit for the marks of the nails, the spices for his burial, the rising dough for the resurrection, and the stone shape for the boulder across the tomb.

The chocolate Easter eggs remind us that Jesus was placed in a tomb with a huge stone rolled in front of it, and that the tomb was empty on the third day as Jesus was no longer dead, he was alive again. As we share our festive foods during Easter-tide, let's remember Jesus who died to save each one of us from our wrongdoings.

DEFIBRILLATORS There are two community defibrillators within the village. They are located on the side of the village hall in Pinfold Lane and on the side of the Vintage Car Garage on Louth Road.

TRIM TRAIL The installation of a new adult Trim Trail has now been completed on the 8 Acres Playing Field. The Trim Trail is a fitness facility that has parallel bars, hurdles, pole climbs, straddle jumps, balance beams, leap frogs and step ups and can be incorporated into a leisure or exercise programme. It is hoped that this new addition to the playing field will be used by many groups including schools, fitness groups and residents who are looking to get fit.

PRECEPT We are pleased to say that for another year we will not be increasing the precept. Where many other local councils are increasing theirs by as much as 13%, Holton Le Clay Parish Council has managed to keep theirs at the same level as last year. Throughout last year enough funds were raised by the council to put them in a position to bridge the gap between the precept and the daily running costs whilst at the same time putting in new equipment around the village such as litter bins, new points of interest at the war memorial, CCTV, and more recently, an adult trim trail.

WALL OF REMEMBRANCE Thank you to Allen Tacey, one of the volunteers for MERC who recently installed several new vases on the cemetery wall of remembrance. Allen did this voluntarily and he has done an excellent job.

BLOCKCRETE As many people will be aware, the block crete in part of Picksley Crescent has now been installed. It is hoped that a further programme of block crete installation will be done in the coming year. If anyone has any suggestions as to where they would like to see this being done please contact the clerk by email or on the office number. Although the block crete does not resolve the problem of people parking their vehicles on grass verges it does help to preserve the verges a little and improves the look of the village. ON CUE

I wonder if you have ever had a part acting in a play? Perhaps you have done it at school, or in the church nativity play at Christmas time. If so, you will know how important it is for the actor, not just to know his lines – that is, the words which he has to say – but to know his 'cues' as well. The.

cues are every bit as important, because they are the signals which tell the actor when to come on stage and when to speak, so that he does it at the right time. A cue can have many forms: it may be the end of a piece of music, or simply a light played suddenly on the stage, or, more usually, just the words of another actor. But, whatever it is, you have to be ready to come in 'on cue'. To miss a cue can throw a play into utter confusion, unless somebody else on stage is clever and quick enough to cover up the mistake.

There is a story of an actor in a play, in which an argument was taking place on stage, and, at the right moment, he had to say the words 'Shut up!' But, in rehearsal, he had kept coming in at the wrong time, and, before the first performance, the produce told him to wait until the argument had started, then count to sixteen, when it would be time to speak. So he did as he was told. 'Ten – eleven – twelve, - then his knees began to shake – 'thirteen – fourteen – fifteen – and then he rushed forward, but instead of saying 'Shut up!" he said 'Sixteen!

Jesus once told a story of two men who missed their cue, and of another who recognised it. A wounded man was lying by the roadside, bruised and bleeding. Suddenly a priest came by and, although he knew immediately what he ought to do, he missed his cue and left the wounded man lying there. Then a Levite, a temple worker, came past and, when he saw the wounded man, he missed his cue too, for he kept on walking. At last, a stranger, a Samaritan, came by, and as soon as he saw the man lying there, he knelt down, tended his wounds, put the man on his donkey and even paid for his keep at a hotel, until he was better. And, having told his story, Jesus said to people who heard it, 'Go and do likewise' (Luke 10:370. What he was saying was that whenever we meet anyone in any kind of trouble, then that is our cue, and, as Christians, we will not miss it.
