## EDUCATION - END OF THE SCHOOL YEAR

Each morning during term time you set off to school. Some of you may be pleased to go and look forward to what you are going to do during the day; others of you may wish that you could stay at home instead.

However you may feel about school, unless you receive home tuition, you have to attend, because it's the law that 'all young people must be educated' If you had lived 150 years ago, you would possibly have loved the chance to learn at an institution because only a few children had the opportunity.

In fact, many children had to go out to work. Indeed, most of you would have probably been working long, tiring hours in a mill or some other trade. However, in 1870 a law was passed that laid down that schools were to be provided for all children between the ages of 5 and 13. School Boards were set up to build the schools that were necessary. Since then schools have been built wherever they were needed.

Have you ever heard the saying that schooldays are the happiest days of your life? Do you agree with this saying? It is likely that whoever first said it was probably an adult! It seems that for most young people the idea that life doesn't get better than this must be something of a worry! Paul Merton, from TV's Have I Got News For You, said, 'My schooldays were the happiest days of my life; which should give you some indication of the misery I've endured over the past 25 years.'

But is school really that bad? Surely there are some positive aspects.

The memories of fun, friendships, fights, fears, failures, fashions and first love will leave a lasting impression in your heart that years from now will cause you to chuckle and bring a tear to your eye.

Today we have greater opportunities than ever before, but it is up to each one of us to make the most of them - to be conscientious in our work so that we may learn all we can; to learn when to give and take and how to live with others; and to obtain for ourselves wisdom and understanding:

God blesses everyone who has wisdom and understanding. Wisdom is worth more than silver; it makes you much richer than gold.

Wisdom is more valuable than precious jewels; nothing you want compares with her. In her right hand Wisdom holds a long life, and in her left hand are wealth and honour. Wisdom makes life pleasant and leads us safely along.
