Thought for November 2018 The Lion lies down with the Lamb!

I recently found myself watching a TV program 'Cold War - Hot Jets' about the Delta V force in the RAF. A deterrent needed in the post war nuclear age, by this country to make the Soviets think twice about attacking, despite us being a base for American nuclear weapons. A force of quick reaction jet heavy bombers, the most famous being the Vulcan that, in their day were more advanced and capable than either the Americans or Russian could match.

The crews that manned this force were in a constant state of readiness and isolated from society by the Official State Secrets Act, by the heavy responsibility placed on them and the knowledge that if they were ever deployed for real, it was a one-way trip to Armageddon. The world as such would have ended.

This year we celebrate both centenaries of the end of the 1st World War and the forming of the RAF. Both are important as well as salutary because the cost of war as well as peace is immense, personally, financially, spiritually and environmentally. We remember today because we owe a great debt to those who gave their lives and also those unsung heroes who have defended us and continue to do so and many who bear the unseen scars. Make no mistake, we need defending from the continuing great evils in the world that seem to rearing their heads again. Jesus says "Peace I leave you such as the world cannot give."





When Hilda was 13, no one could have imagined how important she was going to become. She would have been very surprised herself. Hilda grew up in Northumbria and was a relative of King Edwin. When he was baptised by Bishop Paulinus of York, the whole family followed his example. Twenty years later Hilda decided to become a nun.

Bishop Aidan of Lindisfarne heard about the intelligent and devout nun, and shortly before he died he made her abbess of a convent at Hartlepool. After a few years she founded a new monastery on the clifftop at Whitby. It was a double monastery, where monks lived in one building and nuns lived next door. Hilda was the abbess in charge of the whole community and was a very successful and strong leader. At this time there was a quarrel going on between Christians in the south who followed Roman traditions, and Christians in the north who followed Celtic ones. A conference was called to settle the argument, and the bishops chose Whitby as their meeting place. Under Abbess Hilda's guidance the discussions went smoothly, and although she personally supported the Celtic Church, it was decided that everyone should follow the traditions of Rome and the Church of Canterbury.

Many people travelled to Whitby to be advised by Hilda: kings, princes, and bishops, and ordinary people also. They had heard of her holiness and wisdom and knew she would welcome them. It was said that all who knew her called her mother, such was her gracious godliness. She was very concerned that her monks and nuns should do some serious study of Scripture, and she insisted that priests should be properly trained for the task.

In fact, Hilda believed that everyone should be encouraged to develop their talents. She invited one of her herdsmen, Caedmon, to become a monk so that he could make use of his love for writing verse. He became the first English poet. Another of her monks became Bishop of Hexham and later Bishop of York. He is honoured today as St John of Beverly. By the time Abbess Hilda died in 680, she was loved and respected throughout the land.
