Thought for June 2017 Be amazed & walk the Labyrinth!

The Archbishops have asked us to join in their 'Call to Prayer, Thy Kingdom Come: A Global Wave of Prayer.' Our world faces many challenges and the need for prayer has never been greater. In the West we have forgotten how simple and satisfying it can be. We imagine that prayer is hard or has to use formal words or formula but many pray without realizing they are. Our mobile phones & 24/7 world make it hard or so we think even to try, unless in an emergency.

The truth is we can pray 'anytime, anyplace, anywhere' to quote the advert and there is 'a wonderful world we can share' when we rediscover how. Mindfulness is now popular, which is at the heart of prayer, becoming aware of ourselves, the world and God. THE PAINTED CLIFFS

'how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all that were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.'

There is a story of a minister who said that he would be spending his holidays preaching on Rhum, Eigg and Muck! If these sound strange

subjects for sermons, maybe I should tell you that they are part of a group of islands off the West Coast of Scotland known as the 'Small Isles'.

Leaving Mallaig on the steamer *Mor*, the traveller can sail to Eigg, Muck and Rhum, and then through the Cuillin Sound, with Skye to the north, into the channel between the islands of Canna and Sanday.

Approaching Canna, there are two things that will strike him. Firstly, he will notice a number of fishing boats anchored just off shore. Then, as he draws nearer, he will notice the cliffs behind the pier- all two hundred yards or so of them, and about 60 feet high – covered in different colours of paint! Coming nearer still, he discovers that the paint, in fact, is lettering. The cliff face is covered with the names of fishing- boats, their registration numbers, and the record of their home port – many, of course, from Scotland, but others from as far off as France or Norway.

One traveller, asking how the practice began, was told that the crew of some fishing boat had once visited Canna and, before sailing wanted to leave some mark showing that they had called there. So the crew, lowered by rope down the cliff face with paint-pot and brush in hand had recorded their visit in that way. Many others were to follow, each crew keen to leave its mark behind, and so the cliff face at Canna is covered in paint.

Every day, we too are leaving our mark behind us. Not with a paintpot and brush, of course, nor on a cliff face, but we do it on the minds of other people by what we say and do and how we behave.

Peter once said a fine thing about Jesus, when he spoke about 'Jesus of Nazareth.... who went about doing good' (Acts 10:38). How wonderful to leave a mark like that wherever we go.
