

<u>Thought for October 2017</u> <u>I am my brother's keeper!</u>

I have just attended a Safeguarding training course, as I am required to do by the Church of England. As many of you will know it is compulsory for many walks of life and organisations that deal with people, whether they are children or adults. One of the things that come out clearly is that we can all become vulnerable to harm or abuse. This can take various forms not just sexual but also physical, emotional, neglect, discrimination, and institutional, spiritual, domestic, financial or material abuse. Sometimes this can be unintended but mostly we are aware of the intentional by people who misuse power or authority over others and it marrs our human dignity.

We often think of children and sad cases come to mind but we also are more and more aware of adults who become frail and are taken advantage of. It seems sad that as we become more aware of things that are not right, technology gives us the means to commission new forms of abuse e.g. online bullying, identity & banking fraud, computer hacking or radicalisation to name but few and we all can become victims.

There are procedures that I, the Church and other organisations have to follow when we become aware of safeguarding issues but more importantly, just as we all can become vulnerable, we all can notice when things don't seem right and we have a duty to flag these up appropriately especially where there is criminality involved. Jesus said, "Treat others as you would have them treat you." Matt 7vs 12

Kathleen Lonsdale (1903 – 71) was born into a poor English family, who moved to England when she was still a child. Kathleen was good at science and maths subjects, and she went to these classes at the boys' school because in those days the schools that girls went to did not always teach science. 6

Kathleen became a scientist and worked on crystals. All through her life she was excited by crystals and their amazing shapes and patterns.

Kathleen was a Quaker Christian and this meant that she believed in peace, not war and fighting. In 1939, when war broke out, she refused to do any war work because of her beliefs, and she was sent to prison for one month.

Kathleen carried on studying while she was in prison; she also helped fellow prisoners and later became a prison visitor. She and her husband also looked after refugees during the war. She spent much of her life trying to improve prisons; having been in one she knew exactly what they were like.

Kathleen's faith kept her working for peace. For Kathleen, faith and science were similar; both had bits that puzzled her, both demanded a lot of thinking. Kathleen never felt that she knew all the answers, either in science or in faith.

The Bible has many stories about people who were puzzled by life, and they brought their questions to God. People such as the prophet Jeremiah and King David asked God about things that puzzled them. God did not tell them to stop asking questions.

There will always be things that we can't explain but that does not stop us thinking and wondering about the world.
