

Thought for September 2017 God blessed the seventh day!

I have been reading a book 'Food and Faith' by Norman Wirzba, which looks at the spiritual significance of food production and eating. He talks about gardens and remarks that perhaps October should be the first month of Spring. What a strange idea! However, he goes on to explain that while vegetation takes a rest from growing upwards, October is when the roots of healthy life are embedded in the ground. He says, "We say that Nature rests, yet she is working like mad. She has only shut up shop and pulled the shutters down; but behind them she is unpacking new goods, and the shelves are becoming full that they bend under the load."

He goes on, "That, so much of the real work happens underground and is the effect of processes that we can aid but not control." An early first lesson a gardener must learn is to tend the soil. He makes an analogy with our own lives, which are lived at frenetic pace. Like gardeners, we need to slow down and observe the things, which help our lives to grow in a healthy and wholesome way. We need to pay attention to the 'soil' of our lives - the communities and families in which we find ourselves, and spend more time tending them.

As we find ourselves looking towards our annual harvest festival, let's join together in thankfulness for the bounty which we have in food and relationships, and take time to nurture them.
