WATER AID LENT COLLECTION This year Ash Wednesday falls on March 1st which (in the Christian Calendar) means the beginning of Lent. We at St. Peter's Church, here in Holton-le-Clay, will try, during the next six weeks, to raise as much money as possible to send to Water Aid. Another Valentines Day is almost upon us. Fifty million roses will be sold. Acres of trees will die to make cards. The odd people who call their partners "Squidgy Bum" or "Piglet" will be placing messages in the national papers. Why? For once I stopped to wonder who St Valentine was and why he has prompted all this fuss. I checked in my dictionary of saints and discovered that nobody knows. For all I can tell the whole thing could be a conspiracy of stationers, confectioners and florists. Not forgetting the champagne makers and manufacturers of heart-shaped satin cushions, teddies saying " I wuv 'oo," pink balloons and amusing underpants.

There are two third-century Valentines, one a priest and one a bishop, about whom so little is known that they might even be one and the same person. My book says he/they have no connection with courting couples, but mentions that there is an old tradition that birds pair on 14 February.
