**WATER AID LENT COLLECTION** This year Ash Wednesday falls on March 1<sup>st</sup> which (in the Christian Calendar) means the beginning of Lent. We at St. Peter's Church, here in Holton-le-Clay, will try, during the next six weeks, to raise as much money as possible to send to Water Aid. We put money in jars, sometimes this would be the amount which we have saved by giving – up something (e.g. chocolate) for Lent, or maybe we add some because we know the difficulties faced by people in poorer countries.

This year we hope to help in the Development of Madagascar, to drill boreholes to provide access to safe water throughout the region.

We know of a young girl named Neny who spends an hour going to a pond – a breeding-ground for Malaria Mosquitoes which are covered with algae – to fetch just one bucket of dirty water. She makes this trip up to four times a day! Often the water makes her sick and the journey means that she is often late for school, or misses it altogether.

### Holton-le-Clay Parish Council

It has been noted that the bottle bins outside the Lincolnshire Co-Op have been overflowing over the Christmas and New Year period and that an excessive amount of bottles have been piled up next to the recycle bins. The parish council discussed this at the last Full Council Meeting on 16<sup>th</sup> January and it was resolved that the clerk will write to East Lindsey District Council to request additional recycle bins or larger bins.

The signs for the **Best Kept Village** award should be in place around the village by the end of January.

The clerk became aware of some offensive graffiti recently that was spray painted on to the back of a resident's garage, a fence and a tree. The police have been informed. The maintenance operative has removed some of the spray paint and the street cleaning team at east Lindsey District Council were informed of the rest of the graffiti. If anyone has information regarding the graffiti please contact the local policing team, dial the 101 non-emergency number or contact the parish clerk on 01472 234566.

In the spring time there will be a programme of works during which 26 historic graves in the cemetery will be topped up with soil as they are beginning to sink. The clerk will endeavour to contact as many families as possible who may be affected by this work and it will be advertised in advance on the village notice boards and at the entrance to the burial ground.

For once I stopped to wonder who St Valentine was and why he has prompted all this fuss. I checked in my dictionary of saints and discovered that nobody knows. For all I can tell the whole thing could be a conspiracy of stationers, confectioners and florists. Not forgetting the champagne makers and manufacturers of heart-shaped satin cushions, teddies saying “ I wuv ‘oo,” pink balloons and amusing underpants.

There are two third-century Valentines, one a priest and one a bishop, about whom so little is known that they might even be one and the same person.
