ANOTHER FINE MESS

The most unsuccessful hijack attempt ever made took place in 1976. On a flight across America the hijacker rose from his seat, drew a gun and took the stewardess hostage. "Take me to Detroit," he said. "We're already going to Detroit," she replied. "Oh.....good", he said, and sat down again. Everybody gets it wrong sometimes. Perhaps we have let a friend down and she or he are not talking to us, we've failed an exam and we feel terrible, or we've let ourself down when we did something we were especially trying not to do. Feeling a failure is not very nice, and sometimes we just want to give up because we think we've blown it and there's nothing we can do.

In the Bible there is the story of one of Jesus' disciples who

felt just like that. He was called Peter and he really got it wrong. He let his friends down, he let himself down and he let Jesus down. He ran away when Jesus was arrested, he denied he even knew Jesus when he thought that people might recognise him. He actually broke down and wept when he realised what a total failure he was. If we had known him we would have probably wanted nothing more to do with him.



But amazingly the Bible tells us that despite all that had happened in Peter's life, when Jesus appeared to his disciples (after he had been raised from the dead) he didn't give up on Peter and treat him like some sort of outcast. Instead he forgave him, encouraged him and even instructed him to be a leader among the first Christians. Peter put his failure behind him and became a great and courageous leader in the early church.

Even when other people give up on us, even when we feel a total failure ourselves, Christians believe that Jesus never gives up, he helps us to start again because he wants the very best for our lives.
