





Poor facilities for kids and families

Holton le clay has nothing for children, it's at the council border and therefore feels forgotten. The facilities in the village are poor.

More residents to the village would only add more strain to such services as the school and doctors which are both already VERY full .Rather than just more housing being built I would like to see a lovely park being built (like they have in the more deprived areas of the county) and investments made in activities for children at the new village hall (especially during the holidays). HLC is a lovely VILLAGE let's not make it a town!!

Schools need a massive overhaul.

I've lived here since I was small and always loved the close community feeling. Expanding could damage that and make Holton le clay feel less homely. I do feel that the area does not offer enough for their young people. The current committee is made up of mainly older people that are out of touch with the younger generation and have refused to listen to the views of the younger generation. I have no problem with housing developments within the village as I feel we have sufficient schooling, preschool places to cope with it. I would however like to see more activities for the younger generation in the village hall which will is currently made difficult to organise due to ridiculously high hall hire fees. If we are to increase the amount of young people in the village we need to encourage organisations into the village to provide activities for them to do.


