

THINKING ABOUT FOXES AND CHICKENS.

Think about foxes for a minute. That's right. Foxes. Sly as a Fox. Crazy like a Fox. Cute little heartbreaker. Foxy lady. Sleek. Sexy. Self-sufficient. FOXES.

Think about foxes. Now think again. Don't be a chicken? Don't be an idiot. Don't be a fox.
