It is something that people have argued about from the word go in order to understand how this can be. But isn't something that is provable like a maths problem, although we speak in metaphor as though it is, it's much more something like a relationship, some thing that feels right. It's not exactly measureable but it is observable like a mothers love. Christmas is about observing the love of God in action and then recognizing it in ourselves.

For Christians, Christmas is also a time of sadness in that it has become associated with a time of much greed, excess and selfishness. Yes, we all want to celebrate but it should be about love. Charity (a Greek word we translate as love) does get a bit of a look in but mostly as an afterthought as we pass by street collectors tins. There is so much hype about Christmas it's no wonder we often find it rather hollow despite the good works of many.

To have a child should be a wondrous thing but the pressure is on to go back to work as soon as possible and leave the care to someone else at the most formative and precious time. The bond between parent and child is forged in those early years and we seem to go all out to ruin it. Parenthood is THE most important and valuable job in the world. Yet Governments don't really value it and we wonder at the breakdown of communities and the behaviour problems in schools and beyond. We just don't see the link. EXAMS

Children in England are the most tested in the world. According the *Times Educational Supplement*, it is estimated that they will undertake up to 105 tests and exams during their school years. These include SATs – optional and compulsory – GCSEs, NVQs, GNVQs, modular and vocational A Levels, etc. As a result of the pressure this creates, Childline estimates that it receives 800 calls a year from pupils suffering from exam stress. Also the annual cost of exams and tests has increased to more than

What is Britain's highest award for valour in war? Nelson's Column.

But do we really need all these tests and exams? Does being bad at exams make us failures? God clearly doesn't think so. The Bible has numerous examples of people having tests set by God, many of whom were abject failures.

Adam and Eve in Genesis 3 were tested by God in the Garden of Eden. They, of course, failed, but God didn't give up on them. Job was tested by Satan, he passed with flying colours. Jesus at the beginning of his ministry was tested by Satan and passed all three of his exams (Luke 4.1 - 13) In some of these examples, those who were failures went on to achieve greatness because they trusted in God and persevered.
