At the Full Council meeting on the 14<sup>th</sup>
December 2020 Holton le Clay Parish
Council set the precept request for 2021/22
at £68,402

This was the same figure as that for 2020/21.

The Parish Council has carefully considered the needs of Holton le Clay when setting the precept amount and are pleased that they are able to keep the increase to a minimum.

The Parish Council has had to make some very tough decisions and make budget cuts where possible to lessen the financial impact on residents. The necessary budget for 2021/22 is £73,099 the £4,697 shortfall will be met by the income from solar Panels on the Village Hall and existing Council funds.

As of March 31<sup>st</sup> 2021 the Parish Council held funds of: **General Account:** £45,100 (of which £13000 compulsory reserves) **Burial Account** £9402 (For Cemetery upkeep)

The 2020/21 Annual return will be published online in early June, following which it will be available for inspection at the Council offices by appointment.
