This month sees the centennial anniversary of the start of the 1st World War. I think it is important to mark these sorts of events and as important to discover the causes and examine the effects that they had on the nations as well as the ordinary people involved. It is also important not to glorify war no matter how much we admire the bravery of the combatants because the sheer suffering and folly of it all, far outweighs any other consideration. Of course we need to remember, so that at all costs, we can avoid making the same mistakes yet again.

As someone else said, 'In 1914 an act of terrorism in a corner of south eastern Europe led to a crisis spiraling out of control.' So an act of stupidity in a civil war zone in bringing down the Malaysian airline could well, if we are not careful lead to a similar crisis. Tensions are already high but one false move could well be disastrous when two or more empires face up to one another with neither being able or willing to 'lose face'. Sabre rattling is all very well for home consumption but it needs great diplomatic efforts to stop the situation getting any worse and to bring about a peaceful resolution to this dangerous local conflict.

As we know the conflicts in Syria and Palestine are just as dangerous and difficult to resolve but they can only be resolved ultimately by dialogue, understanding and compromise on all sides and the long process of justice being re established for all embarked upon. Jesus said "Treat others as you would like them to treat you." I pray for all a good and peaceful holiday.
