To sow the wind and reap the whirlwind!

Much of news this August around the world has been awful. Whilst the Edinburgh Games were running their course with record medal hauls and hype about the 'friendly games', the trouble spots in the Middle East, Asia and Ukraine rumbled on with the added dimension of I.S.I.S. (now known as Islamic State) causing an even greater headache for the region and the West.

The beheading of the American reporter by I.S. is another low in the saga of Man's inhumanity to Man. Particularly upsetting for us in Britain, is that the act was most likely carried out by a British citizen. Whatever possesses people to do such horrific and brutal acts most people cannot comprehend and yet we know only too well the horrors that we inflicted and were inflicted upon us in two world wars. Technological war feels much easier when we cannot see the enemy's whites of their eyes but the result is the same; that we are brutalized, which perpetuates hatred.

Islam is a religion of peace and most Moslems are horrified at the turn of events. To have such atrocities committed in the name of Islam is an offence to them as much as the acts carried out in Ireland were an offence to Catholics and Protestants alike. Most of us, myself included need a deeper understanding of the Moslem faith if we are not to continue to polarize our society and world. Jesus said 'he who is not against you is for you' Lk 9.49. Whilst Moslems have a different understanding of faith to Christianity it is wrong to demonize and vilify anyone because they are different, as the media seems to sometimes. To get to know and to understand, removes suspicion and leads us to respect and value one another more deeply.

A NURSING HEROINE

In the history of our country, there have been many men who have been proclaimed a hero because of their courage or loyalty, and although perhaps in comparison not many women have become national heroines – our story today is about such a person.

She was born on December 4th 1865, in the village of SWARDESTON, in Norfolk and her name was EDITH CAVELL. At the age of 30, she went to a London hospital to become a nurse, and gained promotions until she became an assistant matron.

In 1907, she became matron of a nurses school in Brussels, which is the capital of Belgium, and she was there when the First World War started in 1914.

Very soon her hospital was full of Belgian and German soldiers who had been wounded in the War, and it fell into German hands after they had captured Brussels. It was at this time that Nurse Cavell, apart from her nursing, started a very dangerous job – she began to help escaped Allied soldiers to get over the frontier into the neighbouring country of Holland.

Well, as you can guess it did not take the Germans long to realise that these soldiers were somehow getting help and they became very suspicious of Edith and warned her of their suspicions.

Nurse Cavell took little notice of the German threats, and carried on helping Allied troops to escape across the border, until the Germans arrested her on 5th August 1915.

She was found guilty of treason and sentenced to death. Despite the protests from many countries, the Germans executed her by firing squad on 12th October 1915.

As you can imagine, the name of Edith Cavell became known throughout the world, and she became perhaps the greatest heroine in the nursing profession. Her story provides an example of both courage and loyal devotion to duty, and offers many lessons.

When the war reached her hospital, she could easily have left to a safe position but she chose to stay on even to work within enemy lines because she knew that the sick and wounded needed her help. As she helped troops to escape over the Dutch frontier, she knew that she was breaking rules and risking herself, but her thoughts were on helping her country and those prisoners of war.

Many times in life, we run away from duty and from danger, not because we are afraid of danger – but because we are afraid of ourselves.

Nurse Cavell knowing that she faced death put her country and others first. When we are asked, or see a chance to help others, let us remember that brave nurse and if we act as she did, we shall all become heroes and heroines for God.
