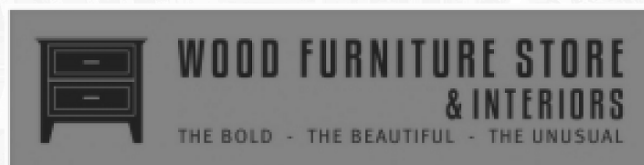

### Junior Playing Field

As most residents will now be aware, there has been an unfortunate  
incident of vandalism on the play park in which a litter bin was  
destroyed and one of the wildlife information tables was smashed. The  
cost to replace the two items was £603.31. The gates to the junior  
playing field will now be locked from 7.30pm. Anti-vandal paint has  
been added to the tops of the entrance gates in order to deter anyone  
from entering the park after hours.

## Lees Luscious Lemon Cheesecake

### Ingredients

700g cream cheese  
85ml lemon juice  
50g caster sugar  
110g digestive biscuits (crushed)  
50g butter, melted  
Mixed berries to decorate



### Method:

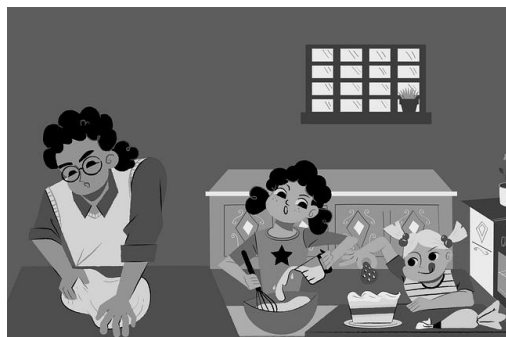
Crush digestive biscuits until small and mix into the melted butter

Spread the mixture out into flat tin lined with greaseproof paper, put in the fridge to cool

Mix cream cheese and sugar until soft, add lemon juice and mix again

Spread mixture onto cooled biscuit base and place in fridge until set (can be left overnight)

Cut into squares or wedges, serve with mixed berries on top.

## New Beginnings

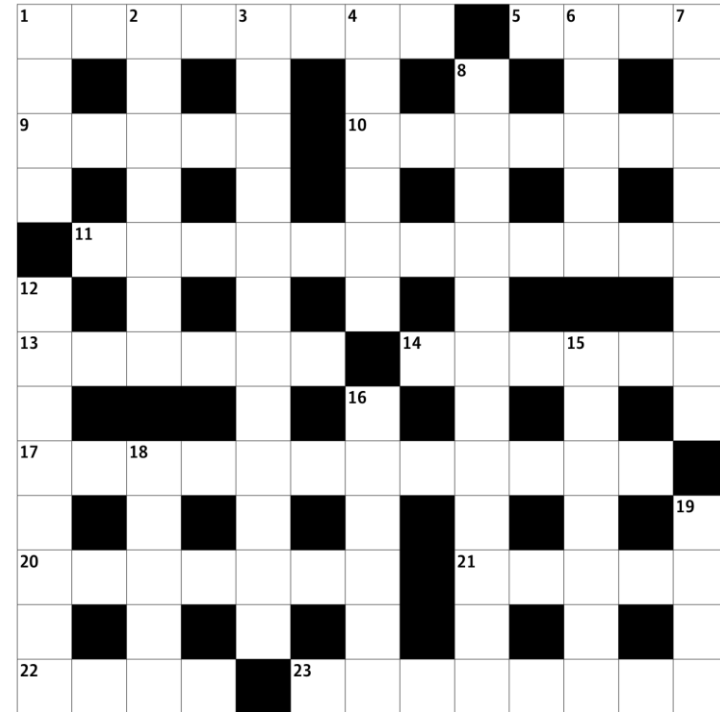

## **June - Colourful Clematis**

From bold blooms the size of tea plates to delicate nodding bells adorning a garden arch, clematis are versatile and colourful climbers that no garden should be without. Whether left to clamber-up a trellis panel to cover walls and fences or trained over a pergola, clematis are a wonderfully diverse family with varieties to choose for flowers in every season of the year.

Choose compact varieties to grow in containers, trained up an ornamental obelisk or wigwam of canes or hazel poles. Several new dwarf and compact varieties have been introduced in recent years too, ideal for planting in tall pots and left to trail over the edges. It's not hard to see why clematis have such irresistible charm, and with so many inspiring ways to include them within the garden and patio your colourful clematis collection is guaranteed to grow!

Top Clematis for Summer colour

- Alabast
- Madame Julia Correvon
- Etoile Rose
- Lasurstern

1. Clematis like their heads in the sun and feet in the shade. Plant so that the soil around the roots is shaded to keep it cool, training shoots up into a brighter, lighter space above.

2. Always plant summer-flowering clematis deeper than they were growing in their pots. Dig a deep hole so the top of the rootball sits about 7-10cm below the soil surface, and bury the base of the stems with soil. This can help plants regrow if they ever suffer from clematis wilt disease. 3. Spread a deep mulch of compost or bark over the soil after planting to lock in moisture and protect from the sun to keep roots cool.

4. All clematis belong to one of three pruning groups depending on when they flower. Talk to the experts at your local garden centre to find out which pruning group your clematis belongs to and get advice on exactly when and how to prune. ### The Village Hall

A fantastic opportunity arose to buy the Etherington Arms Public House in March 2010 and turn it into a new Village Hall to enhance the community facilities in the village of Holton-le-Clay.

The Parish Council have a government loan for the purchase of the building, being repaid over a 15-year fixed period.

There were originally 12 members of Holton le Clay Multipurpose Educational Resource Centre (HLCMERC) a charity set up to fund raise for and manage the Village Hall.

They worked hard to promote the facility and regularly held fund raising events.

The Fund Raising was Car Boot Sales, Victorian Christmas Markets and Christmas and Summer Fayres jointly with the Church Council (HLC PCC).

HLCMERC were able to obtain grant funding from WREN, LCC and ELDC which, along with contributions from HLCPC and HLC Parish Council, allowed to employ a firm of builders Byatt and Board to begin renovation of the ground floor of the Village Hall

The Village Hall opened in May 2014 offering 2 large rooms for hire along with catering and toilet facilities.

The rooms were quickly booked up for a variety of regular classes such as Tai Chi, Pilates, Slimming World, Ballroom dancing, New Age Curling and children's dance classes

The Village Hall also became popular for Children's Birthday parties at weekends

Fundraising events continued to be held by HLCMERC and in 2019, with the help of another grant from WREN, the renovation of the first floor was completed providing lift access to another 2 smaller rooms for hire along with a separate small kitchen and unisex toilet.

HLCMERC continue to manage the building and continue to fund raise.

Funds raised can now be used to enhance the Village Hall and support Holton le Clay Parish Council in maintaining and improving Holton le Clay

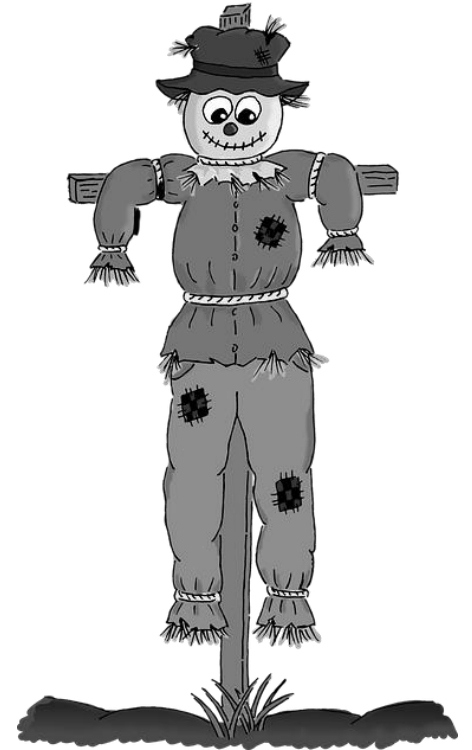
