### **Parish Council News**

#### Bus Passes

Bus pass forms for applying for new passes or renewals can be obtained from the front entrance of the village hall or from the clerk's office on a Tuesday or Thursday. The parish council does not process the forms or take any payment – they must be returned to the Concessionary Fares Office in Lincoln.

#### Best Kept Village

Unfortunately, we were unsuccessful in this year's Best Kept Village competition. Overall, the village scored very well and was commended on the provision of play parks, litter bins, benches and the Adult Trim Trail. The A16 memorial was described as 'delightful' with excellent information boards. The scoring just fell short on community planting, and we were advised to consider areas where planting could be done around the village. We have just taken receipt of two new self-watering planters for the village by the 'Visit Lincs Coast' project, along with a new bench.

#### Lamp Post Poppies

Following the positive feedback the Parish Council received last year on the lamp post poppies, we have purchased some additional poppies for use around the village. Remembrance Sunday is on 13<sup>th</sup> November this year. The annual service will be held at the church and will be followed by a service at the A16 memorial at 12pm and is open for anyone to attend who wishes to pay their respects.

**Holton-le-Clay Parish Council** who are responsible for the village grass cutting, the village Maintenance Operative, the Junior Playing Field, the 8 Acre field, the Cemetery & Parish Gardens, Provision of (but not running of) the Village Hall.

## **One Pan Salmon with Roast Asparagus**

### Ingredients

- 400g new potato, halved if large
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 8 asparagus spears, trimmed and halved
- 2 handfuls cherry tomatoes
- 1 tbsp balsamic vinegar
- 2 salmon fillets, about 140g/5oz each
- handful basil leaves

#### Method



- STEP 1 Heat oven to 220C/fan 200C/gas 7. Tip the potatoes and 1 tbsp of olive oil into an ovenproof dish then roast the potatoes for 20 mins until starting to brown. Toss the asparagus in with the potatoes, then return to the oven for 15 mins.
- **STEP 2** Throw in the cherry tomatoes and vinegar and nestle the • salmon amongst the vegetables. Drizzle with the remaining oil and return to the oven for a final 10-15 mins until the salmon is cooked. Scatter over the basil leaves and serve everything scooped straight from the dish.

### The Airfield – RAF Grimsby

#### St Peter's Church

In the early 1930s, a small grass airfield on the site was used by a local flying club. As commercial aviation developed, the airfield became a municipal airport with services to Hull and Cleethorpes.

In 1938, the site was selected by the Air Ministry as the home for No. 25 Elementary and Reserve Flying Training School, providing basic instruction for pilots. The school disbanded at the start of the second world war when most elementary training was transferred for safety reasons to Commonwealth countries.

In the winter of 1940-41, work began to develop the site for bomber operations. Three runways were constructed, plus hangars and hard standings. The airfield was named RAF Grimsby and was a satellite of RAF Binbrook. The Vickers Wellington aircraft of 142 Squadron moved to RAF Grimsby from RAF Binbrook in November 1941 and flew their first operation, to Hamburg, at the end of the month.

In December 1942, these aircraft departed for North Africa, and the airfield was upgraded to take heavy bombers. In 1943, Avro Lancasters of the reformed 100 Squadron started to arrive, as well as the air and ground crews to fly and service them. The squadron commenced operations as part of the No. 1 Group, Bomber Command. Operations continued almost nightly until April 1945, when the Squadron moved to RAF Elsham Wolds because the runway surfaces at RAF Grimsby had deteriorated through heavy use.

Over the years, the Parish Council has made many improvements to the A16 War Memorial. Commemorative benches, a 'Silent Soldier' and several information tables have been installed.

plus a sign at the entrance. For those that haven't seen the improvements, it is really worth a trip up there to gain an insight into the operations that took place during the second world war.

Some fields are still awaiting the arrival of the combine harvester whilst others show the stubbly stalks of cut grain. Then there are the fields which have been ploughed ready for the seeds of a new crop. Those dark brown fields across the landscape look so fresh and warm. These big machines do all the hard work of ploughing, reaping, separating and gathering so the labour is less intense.

### In Search Of Berried Treasure



Berry-bearing trees and shrubs come into their own in autumn, creating colourful displays that can last well into winter. From elder berries to rose hips, crab apples to firethorns, the addition of berrying plants adds to a new dimension to any garden, with fruits and berries through autumn and into winter.

Berrying plants also provide homegrown food for hungry birds and wildlife too, enhancing their appeal and value to any garden.

To create seasonal pots for autumn colour include a small Gaultheria mucronata carrying brilliant berries in pink, red or pure white. Combined with pansies and violas, trailing ivy, heather, carex or skimmia your pots will put on a display that lasts for months.

Trained against walls and fences, firethorn is a valuable evergreen shrub. Its thorny stems make it a great choice for producing secure garden boundaries, but don't let the spines put you off buying Pyracantha. They provide valuable nesting sites for birds, flowers that attract bees, and red, orange or yellow berries to feed birds into winter.

Explore the cotoneaster family too, attractive ornamental shrubs with year-round appeal. The arching stems with herringbone-patterned stalks of Cotoneaster horizontalis make it an excellent choice to carpet banks and low borders or train up to cover bare fences. Birds love these berries, quickly stripping stems bare as they stock up for winter.

If space allows, many ornamental trees produce bright berries and fruits and good displays of autumn foliage colour. Two of the best families are Rowan (Sorbus) and Crab Apple (Malus), and both make ideal trees for small gardens.

With such a rich and diverse range of plants to choose from, it really is possible to fill your borders with berried treasure this autumn!
