Parish Council News

A16 Memorial The Cenotaph at the A16 memorial has been given a well-deserved makeover. The writing has been refurbished so that it really stands out and the 100 Squadron logo has been repainted and restored to its former glory. It is hoped that the veterans and visitors who attend the memorial service on Remembrance Day will be very pleased with the results.

Lamp Post Poppies Councillor Mik Boon will be busy putting up lamp post poppies again this year in time for Remembrance Day. He will be decorating the lamp posts on Pinfold Lane and Louth Road. The Parish Council has teamed up with the Village Hall Committee (MERC) to purchase more poppies for residents to collect and decorate their own streets. We only have a limited number, so they will be given out on a 'first come, first served' basis. If you wish to be considered for some of the lamp post poppies, please contact the clerk on 07521 467524. If you leave a message, Emma will get back to you to arrange collection.

Cemetery Bin Store The new bin store in the cemetery (to the right of the driveway) is due to have some improvements carried out. The inside of the bin store will be paved and a pathway installed from the driveway to the bin store. This is to make it easier for visitors to access the bins without getting muddy in the process.

WHICH COUNCIL? Holton-le-Clay comes under a three tier Council System and as such it can sometimes be confusing as to who to contact when.

Lincolnshire County Council who are responsible for Schools, Highways (including Street Lights and Pot Holes), Local Recycling centres (Tips), Transport and Health & Care issues and along with several other things they can be contacted on **01522-552222**.

East Lindsey District Council who are responsible for Refuse Collection, Bottle banks, Planning, Licensing and Benefits along with several other things, they can be contacted on **01507-601111**.

Holton-le-Clay Parish Council who are responsible for the village grass cutting, the village Maintenance Operative, the Junior Playing Field, the 8 Acre field, the Cemetery & Parish Gardens, Provision of (but not running of) the Village Hall.

Tonys Traditional Welsh Cawl – Serves 6

Ingredients:

- 1kg neck or shoulder of lamb
- 1 onion roughly chopped
- 6 medium potatoes peeled and chopped
- 3 carrots peeled and chopped
- 1 small swede or 2 parsnips peeled and chopped
- 2 leeks washed and sliced
- 1 small bunch of parsley
- Veg stock
- Salt and pepper



Method:

- Place the meat in a large pan and cover it with water and bring it to a boil. Simmer for 2-3 hours over a low heat or in a slow cooker for 6 hours. Leave to cool, and skim off the fat.
- Cut the meat off the bone and return to the stock. Add all of the root vegetables, simmering until cooked. Add stock to cover the cawl and season with salt and pepper.
- Finally, add the leeks and parsley.

Note – if thicker gravy is required, make a paste of cornflour and water and add it to the stock. Served traditionally with crusty bread and cheese.



Local Walking

Autumn is a beautiful time to get out and go for a walk, meet new people along the way and get some fresh air. Here's a local route from Maureen.

Starting from the Co-op on Pinfold Lane, head left and follow the road around onto Silver Street.

At the top of Silver Street, turn left onto Louth Road until you get to the last house on the left. Go through the gap in the hedge [signposted] and go across the field until the small bridge across the stream.

On right hand side, cross over and continue straight ahead through small woodland area then straight across the field to Tetney Lane.

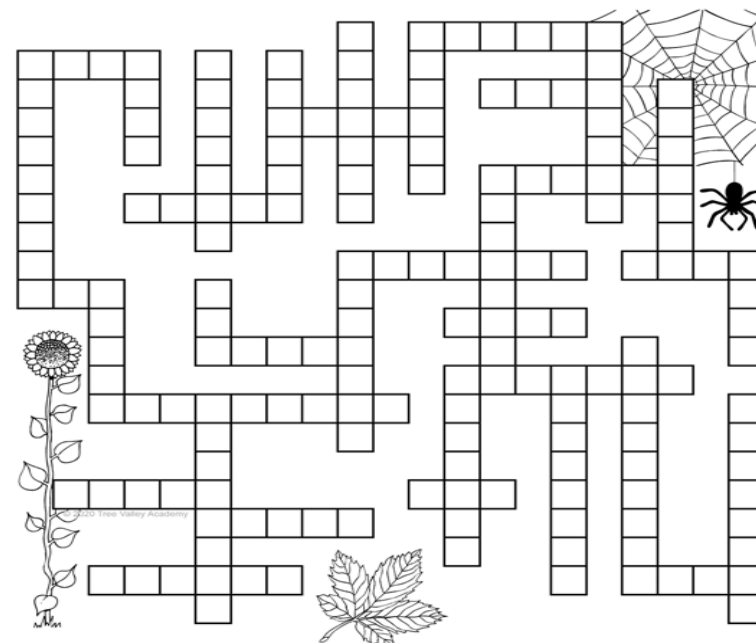
Turn left along the busy road until you reach footpath on left. You'll see the tail of a bomb in the garden opposite.

Continue along the edge of the old railway track to reach 8 Acres where there are plenty of seats to rest. Continue ahead to reach the kissing gate and through into Beech Grove. Turn left, still on Beech Grove onto Magnolia Drive.

Turn left at the end onto Picksley Crescent, cross over the road and go along the public footpath until you reach Pinfold Lane then continue back to the Co-op.

FREE smart wristbands for people living with dementia...



Hundreds of people living with dementia in Lincolnshire will be given **NFC Dementia Safeguarding Bands** containing details of their next of kin, which can be read by a smart phone. A pilot project will see the 'smart wristbands' being distributed across **East Lindsey** and they could be rolled out across the county if successful.

If you live in the East Lindsey district how do you order a wristband?

Those who are a carer or relative of someone living with dementia who is mobile within the community can email: dementiasafeguarding@lincs.police.uk to request a wristband. The name of the person, their date of birth and home address and contact number for the requester should be included.

"It is crucial that people living with dementia can get to a place of safety and security, with friends or family, as quickly as possible."

November-A celebration of colourful cornus

To create a beautiful garden with year-round appeal it's essential to pick the best plants, and few celebrate the seasons more than colourful cornus. Commonly called dogwoods, these reliable and hardy shrubs provide a luscious leafy backdrop to summer flowers. As a final fanfare their foliage is transformed into a rainbow of colours through autumn before fluttering away to reveal brilliant wand-like stems.

This seasonal transformation is just the start of a host of new planting partnerships that can be enjoyed right through until spring. During winter the brightly coloured stems of dogwoods catch sunlight to create dazzling displays. Small gardens might only have space for a single plant, so position it where the low piercing winter sunlight will shine through, catching stems in its spotlight.

No wonder varieties have been given names like 'Winter Beauty' and 'Midwinter Fire' as the intense rays of the sun really bring those fiery-coloured stems to life. Take a look at the whole range of shrubby dogwoods to discover varieties with different foliage and stem colour combinations from 'Flaviramea' with green leaves and golden-yellow stems, 'Spaethii' with variegated, yellow-edged green leaves and red stems, or the white margined leaves and red stems of 'Elegantissima'. Shrubby dogwoods grow well in almost any soil, even moist sites and heavy clay ground. They'll grow best in a sunny position, but will tolerate some shade. Contrasting colours always work well when developing planting combinations, so consider planting groups of two or more dogwoods together.

Also try planting dogwoods in large patio containers to create seasonal displays with a difference, under-planting them with low winter bedding, leafy perennials and small shrubs.

There are dozens of plants to choose from as partners for dogwoods. Some can be planted behind them as a background to enhance the visibility of their stems, while others provide flowering companions through winter. Several low growing plants, like bergenia and heuchera, can be planted around clumps to carpet the ground, or underplant with early flowering bulbs like snowdrops, crocus and narcissus.
