East Lindsey District Council who are responsible for Refuse Collection, Bottle banks, Planning, Licensing and Benefits along with several other things, they can be contacted on **01507-601111.**

Holton-le-Clay Parish Council who are responsible for the village grass cutting, the village Maintenance Operative, the Junior Playing Field, the 8 Acre field, the Cemetery & Parish Gardens, Provision of (but not running of) the Village Hall.

Sausage and bean Casserole for the slow cooker Serves 4

INGREDIENTS

450g [1lb] sausage

1 diced onion

400g tin cannellini beans

Lawn Bowls is not something to do when you are too old for golf. Bowls is competitive and a great social activity. Being a keen sportsman, playing rugby to a good level and in summer months wielding a cricket bat in a somewhat agricultural style, I missed competing.

When an accident resulted in a below-the-knee left leg amputation, I became a touchline critic, watching a game of rugby with my friends, beer in hand, mutually agreeing that "It is not like it was in my days." I decided I needed to do something more active, so when watching a game of bowls one day with my wife in a local park, the club's coach enquired if we had ever thought of having a go. He said that it was a sport for all abilities and that there were no barriers to disabled people.

So it was that the following week we turned to our first experience with lawn bowls. We were hooked by the sport and have been since. Purchasing a set of bowls from a guy online who was a member of Disability Bowls England (DBE), and he suggested I join.

In the last two years, I have travelled the country playing bowls in DBE competitions. Living in Worthing, the travel had become quite arduous; the M25 has very few points of interest, so we decided we needed to move closer to the action, much of which was in the Nottingham area. We would miss the sea, so we decided we could not move too far from the coast. Lincolnshire seemed a lovely county, so we looked for a bungalow in a village and happened upon Holton-Le-Clay. Moving here on the 21st of September, we love it; it feels like home already. Paul Baker

Foraging for natural Christmas Decorations

Express your love of nature this Christmas and turn your home into a winter wonderland by foraging for home décor. Winter offers so many possibilities. Even the simplest, barest branch or handful of pinecones can be transformed into elegant and festive home decor.

What to collect? You're looking for evergreen foliage, twigs, branches, berries, seed heads, colours, textures - anything that catches your eye.

- Seeds, berries and cones: hawthorn, rosehip, spindle, holly, ivy, pine cones, chestnuts, crab apples
- Conifer foliage and branches: pine, cypress, fir
- Evergreen foliage: ivy, holly, mistletoe, eucalyptus
- Twigs, branches and stems: dogwood, oak, birch, willow, hazel, olive
- Seed heads: old man's beard
- Herbs, especially rosemary, bay and sage

Weave together bendy branches or twigs like hazel, willow and ivy (variegated or plain). You can use a circular object, like a wreath frame, as a guide or just freehand for a rustic look. Add ribbons, stars and hearts and hang on doors, window frames and mirrors for a cute and Christmassy look.

Bunch together plant stems and tie them with ribbon, twine or raffia and attach to beams, over doorways or as an alternative to a traditional wreath. Mistletoe and red-berried holly are classics but go for anything that you find out and about, including conifer branches, sprigs of eucalyptus, rosemary and bay.
