### Parish Council News

#### Parish Precept

At the Full Council meeting held on the 19<sup>th</sup> December 2022, Holton le Clay Parish Council set the precept request for 2023/24 at £72,427. This is the same figure requested for the previous year. The Parish Council has carefully considered the needs of Holton le Clay when setting the precept amount and is pleased that they are able to keep the precept at the same level as last year.

- The Parish Council has had to make some very tough decisions and make budget cuts wherever possible in order to lessen the financial impact on residents.
- The necessary budget for 2023/24 is £81,107, and the shortfall of £8,680 will be met by the income from solar panels on the village hall, a contribution towards utilities by the village hall committee (MERC) and existing Council funds.
- To put this into context, this will mean that residents will see an annual cost of £55.58 for the Parish Council element of the Council tax on a Band D property.

### So, where does your £55.58 or £1.06 per week go?

Your money directly supports the administration of the Parish Council, which in turn has been able to provide the following services to Holton le Clay.

- Cutting and maintaining the grass verges, 8 Acres Field and the Junior Playing Field.
- Weed spraying of the village.
- Regular safety checks and maintenance of existing play equipment.
- Provision and ongoing support of the Village Hall.
- Provision and maintenance of the Cemetery
- Daily litter pick of the village.
- A staffed Parish Council office that is open two days per week.
- As well as all of this, the Parish Council continues to liaise with Lincolnshire County Council and East Lindsey District Council on planning matters and highway issues to highlight the needs and views of residents of Holton le Clay.

## **Office Closure**

# SLOW COOKER BEEF STEW

SERVES 4

INGREDIENTS

1 onion, chopped 2 celery sticks, finely chopped 2 tbsp oil 3 carrots, halved and cut into chunks 2 bay leaves ½ pack thyme 2 tbsp tomato puree 2 tbsp Worcester sauce 2 beef stock cubes or stock pots 900g beef 2 tsp cornflour ½ bunch parsley Mash to serve [optional



Cook 4 hours high/8 hours

# Method

- **STEP 1.** Fry the onion and celery in 1 tbsp oil over a low heat until they start to soften – about 5 mins. Add the carrots, bay and thyme, fry for 2 mins, stir in the purée and Worcestershire sauce, add 600ml boiling water, stir and tip everything into a slow cooker. Crumble over the stock cubes or add the stock pots and stir, then season with pepper (don't add salt as the stock may be salty).
- **STEP 2** Clean out the frying pan and fry the beef in the remaining oil in batches until it is well browned, then tip each batch into the slow cooker. Cook on low for 8-10 hrs, or on high for 4 hrs.
- **STEP 3** If you want to thicken the gravy, mix the cornflour with a splash of cold water to make a paste, then stir in 2 tbsp of the liquid from the slow cooker. Tip back into the slow cooker, stir and cook for a further 30 mins on high. Stir in the parsley and season again to taste. Serve with mash, if you like. Leave to cool before freezing. An unusual clipping from a newspaper was located in the archives by Parish Clerk, Emma Portas.

Apparently, the parish council used to provide a special mode of transport to residents called a 'spinal carriage'.

It was used to transport people with spinal injuries who needed to be laid flat. The council also had its own special hand cart for transporting coffins to the cemetery in the village.

Both pieces of equipment were donated to Welholme Galleries where they were part of an exhibition.

We believe they are now in storage.

I've been perusing the minute books of the Holton le clay parish council, which date back to 1909 and I thought I would share some of the interesting bits.

This one caught my eye as being particularly interesting in that we forget teenagers causing nuisance isn't a new thing and that all

generations have been guilty in the past.

"December 11<sup>th</sup> 1935.

Proposed by Mr Smith, seconded by Mr Mason, that the superintendent of police be written to about the conduct of certain of the village youths within the past week or so. 5 windows broken in the Institute, sign posts, lettered directions broken off, railings leading to Church Close to Mr Stephenson's broken. Also a large electric cable drum, which had been left on the grass verge by the telephone people, was removed and rolled down a steep bank and crashed to the bottom of the dyke. Youths collect in the vicinity of the post office and amuse themselves by kicking doors and being very noisy."



I imagine the youths involved in 1935 grew up into fine young men a few years later.
