Public forum opened at 7.15pm.

A member of the public raised a concern with the recent road resurfacing. The resurfacing has raised the height of the tarmac and this is causing issues for cars reversing out of driveways onto the highway. Line markings that were previously on the road have not been replaced. Councillor Marfleet agreed to look into this issue.

Public forum closed at 7.30pm.

52. CHAIRMANS WELCOME:

The Chairman welcomed all those present and thanked them for their attendance.

53. TO RECEIVE AND ACCEPT APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE:

Cllr Terry Aldridge, Cllr David Springett sent their apologies and the reasons for absence were accepted.

54. TO RECEIVE DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LOCALISM ACT 2011:

Councillor Reynolds and Councillor Dodge both declared interests as members of MERC. Councillor Boon declared an interest in Item 66 of the agenda.

55. TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE FULL COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 19TH JUNE 2023:

The minutes of the full council meeting held on 19th June 2023 were accepted as a true record.

56. TO RECEIVE AN UPDATE FROM MERC:

The summer fayre was very well attended this year despite the heavy rain. There will be a Quiz Night on Saturday 22nd July 2023.

MERC is considering changing its charitable status to a CIO (Charitable Incorporated Organisation).

57. TO RECEIVE AN UPDATE FROM DISTRICT COUNCILLORS:

A report was requested from Councillor Stephen Lyons but not received.

58. TO RECEIVE AN UPDATE FROM COUNTY COUNCILLOR:

Councillor Marfleet is looking into having the cycle path on the new housing development installed with a view to connecting it up to the Maples and Louth Road. He has been dealing with the Parish Councils' application to have yellow lines put on the road near the chemist on Louth Road for some time now and this is now with the assessment team. It is hoped that an update will be available by September.

Previous issues raised regarding the flooding in Church Lane are being considered with a view to using new camera equipment that clears any blockages as the camera moves through the drain. It is currently being trialled in other areas of Lincolnshire and will eventually be made available to Holton le Clay.

Councillor Marfleet was asked to look at why the slurry sealing has been marked out in the Pinfold Lane alleyway but no further progress made. He was also asked to find out why the street light in Nursery Gardens that was installed several years ago has never been switched on.

59. TO RECEIVE AN UPDATE FROM MERC REGARDING THE HOLTON NEWS MAGAZINE:

The magazine has been revamped for the August edition and more space has been created for articles. Lots of raffle prizes have been donated. Invoices for advertising have all been paid. The magazine group is hoping to generate interest in advertising within the magazine from businesses outside the village.

60. <u>MATTERS OUTSTANDING - REPORT CIRCULATED TO</u> COUNCILLORS:

Further update to the circulated report – a meeting has been arranged with a Highways Officer on 26th July to discuss the possible locations for the two additional speed signposts. Councillor Lyons and Councillor Reynolds agreed to attend the meeting.

62. PLANNING MATTERS:

RESERVED MATTERS APPLICATION RELATING TO THE ERECTION OF 48NO. DWELLINGS WITH ASSOCIATED GARAGES, PLAY EQUIPMENT, ATTENUATION POND, LANDSCAPING AND INTERNAL ACCESS ROADS IN RELATION TO APPLICATION N/085/01207/20.

LAND EAST OF, LOUTH ROAD, HOLTON LE CLAY

The planning application was discussed at length and the following points were raised:

- The details of the application are different to those in the original plan as the cricket club is now remaining in its current location. It appears that since the cricket club is no longer relocating, additional properties are now planned to utilise the space. The planning committee queried whether the additional properties would mean that more are being built than originally planned. Outline permission was granted for up to 300 houses – will the total figure now be more than the original 300?

- As per the Neighbourhood Development Plan, the sustainability of the village is of utmost importance. There are concerns surrounding the impact that such a large development will have on local infrastructure, doctors, schools and public transport. It is also felt that the increase in properties will have a knock-on effect on traffic congestion particularly towards Toll Bar roundabout.
- Will the roads on the planned estate be wide enough to accommodate waste and recycling lorries and emergency service vehicles?
- Is there a plan to install a cycle path that will connect to Louth Road?
- Why is there only one single access/exit point on the estate?
- According to the plans S106 will be used to fund an equipped play park/trim trail. Who will maintain the equipment and ensure that annual safety inspections are carried out? How will this be funded – will the responsibility fall to the Parish Council with a view to funding inspections through the parish precept?
- Will there be a covenant with regard to caravans and boats being parked on driveways and the public highway?
- Will the adopted Neighbourhood Plan be taken into consideration?
- Three-storey buildings are not in keeping with the character of the village, yet there are several three-story properties on the plans.
